[Conner Lukan "Tighten Your Skates" Award](#)

The Conner Lukan Memorial "Tighten Your Skates" scholarship will be awarded annually to a deserving applicant who is planning to pursue a career as an Athletic Therapist, Physiotherapist, or a related-career that helps heal the body.

[Cpl. Jordan Anderson Memorial Award](#)

This bursary is presented to a graduating student, enrolled in a post-secondary program, who has demonstrated excellence in scholastic effort.

St. Albert Community Band Bill Coates Memorial Award

This award is presented to a Grade 10, 11, or 12 student who has achieved high academic standing and shown considerable commitment and dedication in the school's Music Program.

St. Albert Rotary Club Roy Swanson Memorial Scholarship

Above all else, Stephen Wack valued his relationships with God, family, friends and team-mates. Stephen always had a kind word or helping hand for others; he did what he could to contribute to the various communities he lived in as he progressed through his hockey career. A favourite phrase of Stephen's that characterizes his values is "all roads lead back home".

Stephen strived to live each and every day fully, and he worked hard to reach his potential and turn his dreams into reality. When asked to describe himself on University applications, Stephen wrote, "To put it simply, I am someone who loves the people close to me, loves life and enjoys working hard in all aspects of my life. I take pleasure in living a healthy lifestyle that includes playing competitive hockey, and I have been pursuing my passion for videography while running around various cities and places with a camera."

Stephen's love for the game of hockey, combined with his strong work ethic, guided him along his hockey path and eventually led him into the role of Assistant Captain and Defenceman for the Humboldt Broncos. Stephen was also an honours student, and his creativity and intellect led him to pursue photography and videography alongside hockey. He was a talented, self-taught videographer and intended to pursue a Business Degree and career in Videography.

In lending guidance to a fellow videographer, Stephen wrote, "I think it is almost human nature to feel this kind of pressure, as creators put so much of themselves, their time and energy into their work, and it can be somewhat of a vulnerable thing to put their art out there since it can be an extension of you. I sometimes go back to the phrase, 'done is better than perfect', which can definitely be true."
